## Masters Direct Entry (MDE) vs. Masters Direct Entry / Doctor of Nursing Practice (MDE / DNP)

The MDE and MDE/DNP programs are both for students with non-nursing bachelor's degrees who would like to enter the nursing profession. The programs have the same application requirements, application deadlines, and start dates. Given all that, however, the programs are actually quite different!

Specialties Available	None. MDE students are trained as RNs/Nurse Generalists.	Choose one of the following specialties at the time you apply: Adult Gerontology Acute Care (NP) Family (NP) Midwifery (CNM) Pediatric (NP) Psychiatric/Mental Health (NP)
Working during the program	Work is not recommended during the program.	Work is not recommended during the program (the first 15 months), but once you enter the DNP portion of the program, you may work as a nurse, a TA, etc.
